New Marfleet Behaviour and Wellbeing Ethos

Our ethos aims to provide children with clear boundaries and consequences to behaviours. Our aim is to provide children with the skills and tools to successfully resolve conflict, understanding how the choices they have made have affected others.

We promote positive language and look to find opportunities where children can succeed academically and have good behaviour recognised. We use the language of 'super star' and 'good' but equally we are consistent in our high expectations.

We are passionate about having a whole school approach to behaviour that is consistent regardless of age. Each child is recognised as an individual, and taught important life skills to be able to fit into the school community and is referred to throughout the school day.

It is the key to ensuring we have a calm and stable school environment, but it also allows children to take responsibility for their own choices and actions.

Uniform Expectations

Please ensure that all uniform and PE kit is clearly labelled with your child's name in permanent marker.

- Tops should be white—shirts or polo shirts.
- Bottoms should be grey—trousers, shorts or skirts.
- Jumpers and cardigans should be plain red, ideally with the school logo.
- Socks and tights should be red, black, white or grey.
- Shoes should be black school shoes. They must be flat shoes and **no trainers**.
- Jewellery should be limited to a watch and single stud earrings only and must be removed for PE.
- Makeup and nail varnish is not to be worn.
- PE kit should consist of: black shorts or jogging style bottoms, a white t-shirt and black trainers or sandshoes.

Attendance

As always attending school regularly and on time is one of our highest priorities this year. All children must be at school for 9:00am and ready to learn.

8:00am—Breakfast Club opens.

8:45am—Gates open.

9:00am—Learning starts.

If your child is late more than twice in one week they will now go on late report. If your child's attendance drops below 97% they will go on attendance report.

Each class that achieves 98% or above attendance within the week will get to move around on the Attendance Monopoly board and gain a prize. The class with the best attendance at the end of each half term will win a Pizza Picnic!
