Statement of Intent

We aim to create a reading culture so that every child develops the skills to become a confident reader and develops a real love for reading

- 1. Our aim is that all children will learn to read as early as possible
- 2. Early reading is prioritised and all children in EYFS/Year 1/WT Year 2/WT Year 3 receive both small group and class phonics sessions. Phonics is taught from FS1 upwards
- 3. Parents are encouraged to foster a love of reading at home
- 4. Expectations are high throughout our school
- 5. Children are immersed in stories, poems, rhymes and non-fiction to encourage the love of reading
- 6. We build a home-school partnership

Implementation - Phonics

- 1. Whole class phonics sessions take place daily in EYFS/KS1
- 2. Differentiated small group phonic sessions also take place in EYFS and KS1 /KS2 as necessary
- 3. The lowest 20% of each year group receive extra individual reading/phonics sessions with support staff
- 4. Phonics sounds are displayed in all classrooms
- 5. Children in EYFS/KS1/KS2 as necessary, read books with sounds that they have learned
- 6. Pupils are assessed and tracked half-termly on sounds learned, as well as phonic screens
- 7. We follow the RWI phonics scheme from FS2 onwards
- 8. FS1 are introduced to phonological awareness before they begin the Nursery RWI phonics
- 9. All staff in FS2, KS1, lower KS2 have received RWI training





Implementation - Reading

- 1. Guided reading sessions take place daily in KS2 and Year 2, with quality books chosen from a range of authors, including the Take One Book website
- 2. Year 1 have daily phonic sessions as well as guided reading sessions
- 3. Staff read quality texts to their class at the end of every day
- 4. All children are expected to read at home at least 3 times per week
- 5. Class home reading charts record the number of times each child has read/their record book has been signed by an adult at home
- 6. Children in KS2 choose their class reader from selected year group books at their target level
- 7. Books are changed daily/as necessary
- 8. Children are encouraged to develop a love of reading through-class/home readers, Reading for Real Books, Take one Book, listening to staff reading daily, use of the school library, author visits
- 9. Book/topic areas are inviting/comfortable areas to read
- 10. Quiet reading time takes place in every class Year1-Year 6 daily
- 11. Story time sessions with the librarians are planned, as well as assemblies focussed on reading for pleasure
- 12. All classes have a visit to the library yearly
- 13. Fluency and accuracy is assessed and developed
- 14. Words of the day/vocabulary walls are displayed in each classroom
- 15. Author visits take place at least once a year
